To film & edit, plan your video to run in this sequence:

1	Time Frame 1	□ establishing shot* □ sequence of 1 or more shots for the scene	2 day principal photography
1.5	Montage	at least three-image montage sequence to show passage of time	1 captured footage, 2 stock
2	Time Frame 2	□ establishing shot* □ sequence of 1 or more shots for the scene	2 day principal photography
2.5	Montage	at least three-image montage sequence to show passage of time	1 captured footage, 2 stock
3	Time Frame 3	□ establishing shot* □ sequence of 1 or more shots for the scene	2 day principal photography
3.5	Flashback Ends	□ establishing shot* □ Interview style storytelling	shot in the studio by appt.

^{*}Establishing shots can be captured footage, stock video, or a still image. Establishing shots for scenes 2, 3, and 3.5 are only required if the setting changes from prior scene.
